


# St. Mark Parish

#### We just never miss a beat- quite literally!

For example, our Pre-K spent the last week learning about the history of the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade! They read the story Balloons Over Broadway and then made their very own balloon puppets for their own parade. Their smiles speak for themselves. Our PreK rocks because of the hard work Mrs. Melvin-Marko and her aide, Mrs. Virginia Greuloch each brings into the classroom daily.

As part of the commitment we have made to support our Veterans, every student made a Christmas card for the Veterans Last Patrol organization as part of their Annual Holiday Salute. Their mission is to BEFRIEND, HONOR, and SUPPORT veterans on their Last Patrol. As I read through the children's cards, so many of them referred to these Veterans currently in hospice as heroes. We are blessed as a nation because of these heroes, and if a small smile came to their faces because of what the children wrote, we have done our job. Our 5<sup>th</sup> Grade students spent time this past month studying air resistance. To put what they learned into practice, they were able to use

Students bounced basketballs, tossed dodgeballs, glided on scooters, and jumped high and far to experience the principles of force and motion in action. Each station brought the laws of physics to life. Having fun while learning can lead to better learning outcomes and helps students stay engaged and motivated. Great job, Mrs. True!

Our Student Council sponsored a paid dress down day last month. In total, students donated \$805.00 which was sent to Catholic Charities for the relief fund which was established for those impacted by Hurricanes Milton and Helene. Catholic Charities has been providing relief with necessities such as water, food, and shelter while long-term recovery takes place. The leadership our Student Council has shown sets a great example for all of us!

Education is always challenging students to look at things from a **different perspective**. Do we choose to see beyond anything ever imagined before? Do we choose to see the possibilities awaiting? Do we choose to add a different perspective- a different possibility- which **transforms the ordinary** into something extraordinary. At our 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Awards Ceremony, I challenged our children with this thought: "Think about that plain empty piece of white paper Mrs. Hanna gives you to draw on in art. You have drawn some very beautiful masterpieces to fill that empty piece of white paper. So many parishioners comment about the beauty of your work and offer to buy your artwork! Today, we live in a world full of innovative ideas because people much like you, have chosen to look beyond what is possible, chasing their dreams and building them into today's realities." The lesson that I wanted all of them to remember is that **each one of us** is gifted with unique and special talents. It is our job to discover what those gifts are! Sometimes it takes a great deal of hard work to discover those talents, which is why we celebrate our students' achievements at an Awards Ceremony.
