


St. Mark Parish

PARISH GRADE SCHOOL

"There is this girl who stole my heart and she calls me Daddy." In early December, we held our annual all-school father (or important person)-daughter dance called *The Snowflake Ball*. It was yet another magical moment in St. Mark's history, and it is still one of my most favorite events. It is hard to believe that we have done this for 12 years! Over 150 "couples" attended the ball. As was the case in previous years, I heard girls of all ages talking about their dresses being matched perfectly to their dads' ties. Being a shoe lover myself, it was adorable to see how many of the girls had shoes that matched their outfits as well!

But before the magic happened, several teachers and some After-care students helped to fluff trees and decorate. Before my eyes, our Gym was quickly transformed into a forest of white and green trees canopied with snowflakes overhead in the lobby. Before I realized it, I found myself anxiously awaiting the arrival of our very special couples. Many of the girls were wearing small wrist corsages and proudly wanted to show them to me at their arrival. As they waited in line to get their "Couple Photo" taken, I found myself thinking yet again that every one of the girls looked like a beautiful princess- not because she had a prince, but because she had her king with her. My favorite part of the evening was watching dads with their princesses dancing in their arms. As I watched, I was reminded of this quote: "A daughter is someone who fills your heart with love and your days with joy. She is someone who changes your life from the moment she becomes a part of it, and then makes you wonder how you ever lived without her." I did find some humor in the evening when at one point, the pile of shoes had grown because the girls found that they could "slide" better on the gym floor! The dads just did not have that same slide down! I am not so sure the girls returned home with the same pair of shoes they came in, but I can assure you that everyone left with a pair! One of our dads told me that he and his daughter had practiced slow dancing all week in preparation for the evening. These are the stories I love hearing! Our DJ, Carl, from *Just Playin' Around*, did another outstanding job in his role as DJ for the evening. He certainly kept things moving all night.

Our dads could not have been prouder of their little girls. "I look at you, and I do not see the passage of time. I see my little girl playing dress up, running through the yard, playing on a swing. You must understand that to me, you will always be my little girl, I may not be able to carry you in my arms anymore, but I will always carry you in my heart." (Author unknown) As I looked at some of the photos I took of our 8th Grade girls, I remember so vividly what they looked like as preschoolers attending their first dance. How grown up they are in such a relatively short amount of time!

As vacation neared, I found myself reflecting on so many different things. I thought about how important relationships are. Relationships are imperative because they have a direct effect on our emotional well-being. We struggle when we don't have that in our lives. We need someone to count on, someone we can trust, and someone we can turn to when faced with challenges, even if it is just to lend an ear

I thought about the many blessings I have in my life. My husband has been my rock for almost 50 years now, and my family and friends are always so supportive of my endeavors. I thought about how wonderful it is to have three beautiful grandchildren, ages seven, three, and one. It is hard to believe that the baby has just turned one! New life is truly a miracle. It has been so fun to watch Rocco's siblings interact with him, loving him so affectionately, and then sometimes not so affectionately when he goes after one of their things! All of us need to take time to appreciate the important people in our lives and not take them for granted.

I thought about how loving our school children are. They share their affection all the time- it's one hug after another as I pass them in the hallways. I sometimes watch them in the cameras as they walk the hallways skipping! It is precious! I try skipping with them sometimes, and they just giggle!

And finally, I thought about the one common thread woven through all of this – my faith. It is a great time of year to think about and appreciate all that God has given us. Living my faith every day through the eyes of children is such a privilege for me. Having the church so close to my office, allows me time to stop in sometimes just to say a quick "Thank you." This is an even greater privilege. Working with children every day is a qift. They really are our hope for the future.
